





Dear Families,

Thank you for following our new drop-off routine. Many of you have commented that starting the school day in this way has supported their child. Despite the cold and frosty mornings, the children and staff have found this new routine helpful.

Ms Fields our Community Liaison Officer has left Knockhall Primary School, and we wish her all the best for the future. Please continue to contact the school office regarding your child's attendance and continue to report their absence.

As I mentioned last week, I have been analysing the most recent parent survey with the leadership team.

You said that you found the way that we plan and deliver our homework challenging and that your children do not have access to a tablet which prevents them from downloading the work set.

Moving forward we will be reducing our homework expectations to daily reading and daily Times Table Rock Stars for all children.

Research tells us that reading or sharing a book with your child every day helps them to develop their language skills, imagination, and intelligence. We want your children to have the best possible start to their educational life and reading is fundamental to this. This is why we would like you to focus on reading at home every day.

Times Table Rock Stars develops children's ability to recall their times tables which is a fundamental skill in mathematics. We've chosen Times Table Rock Stars as it's a fun and interactive way for the children to learn and recall their times tables.

If as a family, you would like your child to access additional homework then we also have Reading Plus, Accelerated Readers, and <a href="www.thenational.academy">www.thenational.academy</a> Login details for these websites are in your child's reading log however if you need help with this then please let your child's class teacher know. I hope that this will ensure homework is less challenging and as a family you will be able to engage in the most appropriate home learning for your child.

In response to your comments regarding The Pantry, I have fed this back in a meeting I had with them this week. I have also spent time in the lunch hall analysing your children's response to the food that The Pantry provide. Over the next few weeks, an area manager from The Pantry will be supporting with our kitchen at Knockhall Primary School and we hope this will improve things for your children. The Pantry will also be available to meet with you during a morning drop-off and an evening pickup at Knockhall (date to follow). 


# What have the children been learning this week in Nursery ....


