Topic Overview -

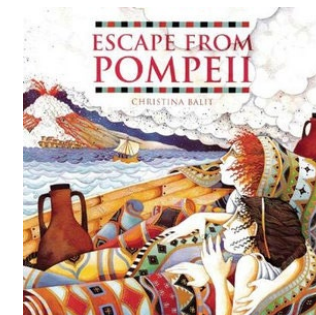

The Empire Strikes!

English

Throughout the term, we will be exploring 'Escape from Pompeii' Students will be expanding their understanding of writing historical fiction with an 'Escaping the Monster' theme. We will also be producing our own 'Escape to Pompeii' travel brochures.

Maths

Children will explore and calculate using money and time. They will focus on their multiplication tables and problem-solving and reasoning skills.

Science

Children will look back over previous learning from Year 3, including Living Things and their Habitats and Animals including Humans.

History

In this topic, children will learn about the origins of the Roman Empire. They will explore life as a Roman soldier and the famous battles which took place, including at Watling Street against Boudicca. They will finally learn about what life was like in the Roman times and what they invented which we still use today.

DT

Children will be investigating textiles and using a range of equipment to develop their joining skills. They will build on their knowledge from year 2 and create an emblem for a Roman Centurian.

PHSE/RE

During RE week, students will be expanding on their understanding of the Buddhist faith from previous years. This unit of work will focus on family life within this religion. Students will continue to develop their self-awareness and British Values through weekly character sessions.
