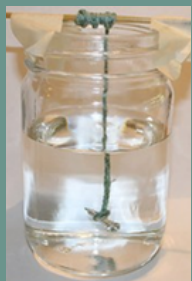


LKS2

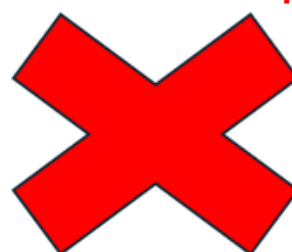
