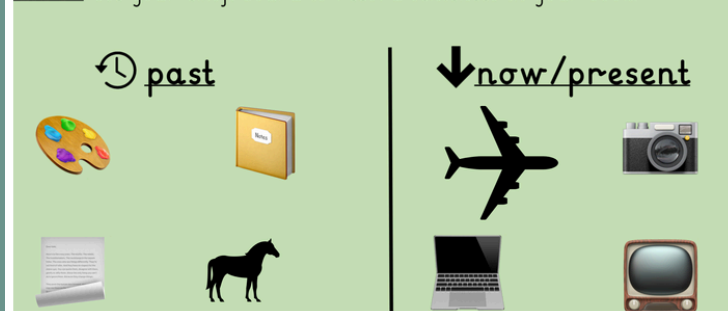


KS1

Task B - Use your emoji board to record sentences in your book.



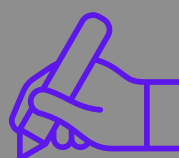
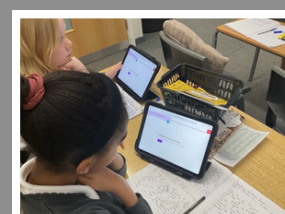
LKS2

Year 4 were engrossed in their big bang day with Time Capsule Tim



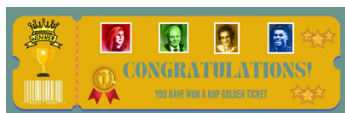
UKS2

Urgent Safety Reminder

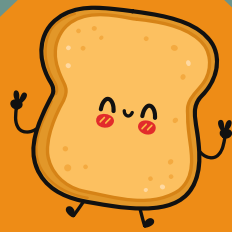

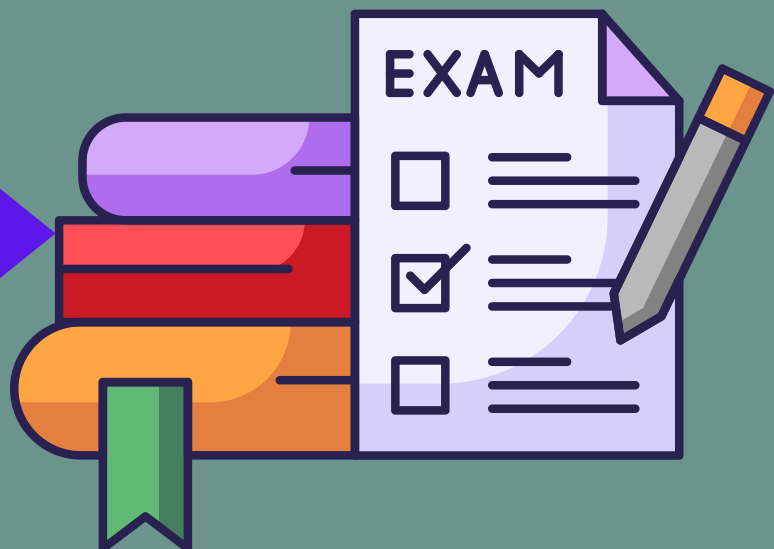
