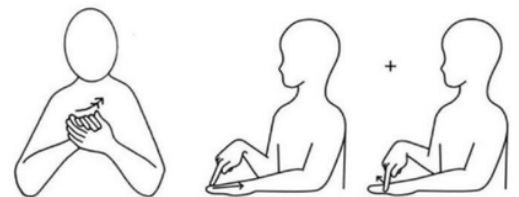

Nursery News

This week, we have started our new story Errol's Garden. The children were very excited to plant and grow their own flowers, and each child planted a sunflower seed to take home and continue nurturing. In class, we enjoyed designing our own magical gardens and learning all about the life cycle of a flower and its different parts.

In our NELI sessions, we read The Boy and the Bear and explored the different seasons and the clothes we wear. The children have been practising patience, just like the boy who had to wait while his friend, the bear, went into hibernation. They have been asking lots of thoughtful questions and using full sentences to explain their ideas.

The children have also been exploring lots of creative ideas this week, using their imagination in both their artwork and play.

Reception News

Reception children have been busy exploring the fascinating world of African wildlife through reading the story One Day On Our Blue Planet...in the Savannah! They have been learning about a variety of animals that live in Africa, including powerful lions and learning the difference between diurnal and nocturnal animals. As part of their learning, the children have also been finding out about where Africa can be found on a world map and then identifying other countries of personal significance.

KS1



Year Two had a great time examining various fruits and vegetables in their DT lesson last week. As a class, we discussed where the fruit and vegetables originated from, how they tasted, and whether we liked or disliked them. The Brussels sprout was not very popular, but the children were able to try new foods and share their opinions with confidence.



LKS2



In Year Four we have been learning all about the Ancient Greeks, and how they have had an impact on modern times and created a 3D Greek vase using clay. We used different techniques to create ours. First, we warm up the clay by kneading it with our hands because this made it softer and easier to shape. Next, we used our fingers to press, roll, and shape the clay into different forms and textures. Tried pinching, smoothing, and adding patterns using tools or even your fingertips!

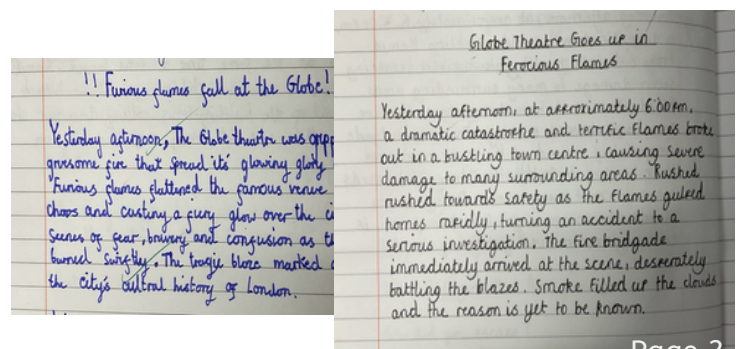


UKS2
