What have the children been learning this week in Year 1








What have the children been learning this week in Year 2

What have the children been learning this week in Year 3

During the afternoon, the children were tasked to create either a hospital or a fire/police station. They worked in groups to plan, design and bring their creations to life! 
Our School Values In Action


