KHP were entertained with some amazing live performances during the Music assembly held on Wednesday this week.


We had parents, staff and the music teacher singing and performing various instruments.

The children have been taking part in very respectful discussions this week as part of Mental Health week and Safer Internet day, linking this to our school rules and values.


They have given **honest** reflections about how they can support others and ensure their happiness and safety.


